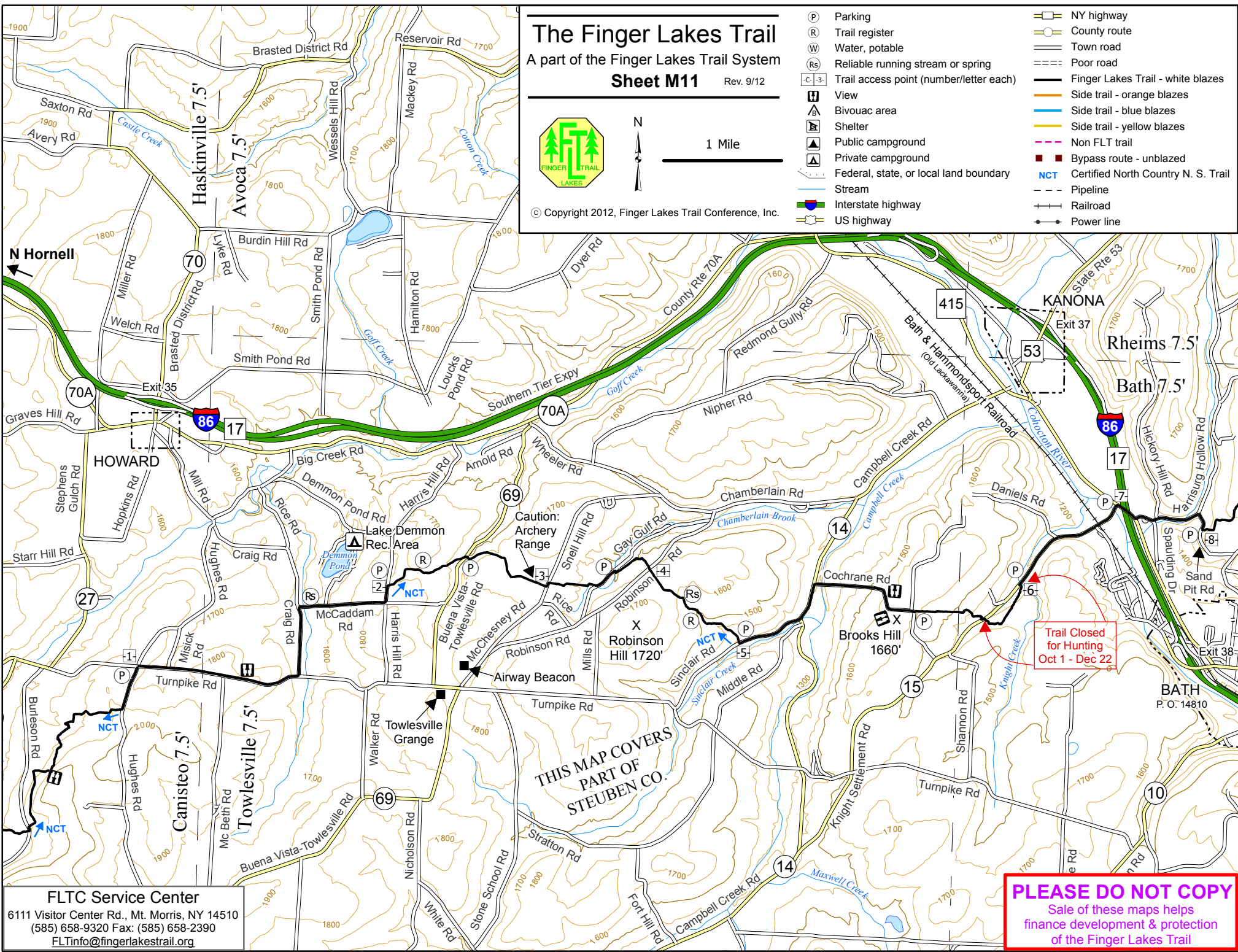

Miles    Description of Trail from West to East

- 0.0 Access 1 Turn right (east) from Hughes Road onto Turnpike Road (1830', shoulder parking), down long hill, then up other side. Pass one road on left, then another one on the right (excellent views to north).
- 1.4 Take a left (north) on Craig Road at bottom of last long downhill. Pass beside swamp, with some evidence of beaver activity, on level road, to the first right.
- 2.0 Turn right (east) on McCaddam Road (1570'), which eventually goes uphill.
- 2.7 At Harris Hill Road turn left (north). Continue downhill to trailhead (shoulder parking). About a mile northwest of here is the Lake Demmon Recreation Area, a private campground.
- 2.9 Access 2 Turn right (east) off Harris Hill Rd. (1700', shoulder parking). Trail skirts swamp then follows wooded hedgerow to open maple forest. After trail register trail follows what seems to be the top of a glacial esker that is fairly level hiking. Then descend to cross a stream.
- 3.7 Cross County Road 69 (1600', parking) to uphill woods road to farm lanes at level top (1740'); curve around southern end of swamp, turn left at dirt lane "T" intersection. **Caution: As you approach Snell Hill Road within about 200 yards there is an archery target range.** Continue on lane past archery range on left through open woods, then along yard edge to Snell Hill Road.
- 4.5 Access 3 Jog left on Snell Hill Road then right off road through woods and fields to Gay Gulf Road.
- 5.0 Turn left (NE) on Gay Gulf Road (1560'). In 0.2 mi. (after crossing bridge, shoulder parking) leave road on right, then follow woods edge until right turn into hedgerow to Robinson Road (1610').
- 5.6 Access 4 Cross Robinson Road, aiming for lone tree and telephone pole, then follow right (south) side of hedgerow into forest. These will be the last woods with any "privacy" for several miles. Then descend hill on former tractor lane, keeping woods on your right (south), toward small outbuildings in field, to Sinclair Road.
- 6.7 Access 5 Turn left (northeast) onto Sinclair Road, a dirt road (1290', shoulder parking).
- 7.3 Turn left on Campbell Creek Road (CR 14, 1240').
- 7.6 Turn right (east) onto Cochrane Road (1210'), cross Campbell Creek, and go uphill on a long steep dirt road through farm fields, to see almost 360 degree view throughout top of hill (1650').
- 8.6 Bear right (south) on Cochrane Road. Immediately after the turn (shoulder parking), turn left into the field. Follow the hedgerow, occasionally crossing from one side of the hedgerow to the other. Then descend through field under power line.
- 9.2 Turn left on Knight Settlement Rd (CR 15, 1310'). **Caution: Heavy traffic. Note: Trail ahead to Access 6 is closed for hunting Nov. 15 - Dec 22. Bypass closed trail using Knight Settlement Rd.** In 150', turn right off the road, walk behind the barn and enter the woods. Ascend 100' through woods and field, then gradually descend through woods.
- 9.8 Access 6 Turn right (north) on Knight Settlement Road (CR 15, 1220'). **Caution: Heavy traffic.** Good parking on west side of road 100' north across Knight Creek. Follow the road gradually downhill to the Cohocton River and NY 415.
- 11.0 Access 7 Parking at DEC fishing access on left at NY 415 (1110'). Follow NY 415 right SE under I-86/NY 17, then left on Spaulding Dr., left on Harrisburg Hollow Rd., and right on Sand Pit Rd. **Note: Through hikers may wish to take NY 415 1.4 mi. south into Bath, where there are many facilities such as restaurants, motels, and grocery stores.**
- 11.9 Access 8 Ample shoulder parking on Sand Pit Road (1240'). Trail leaves road going uphill to left (north).

When map and marked route differ: follow signs, blazes, or even temporary flagging tape.

All off road portions of the FLT on this map are certified as official (NCT) North Country National Scenic Trail. Sections of the FLT marked NCT are official certified segments of the 4600-mile NCT.

Regulations:

1. Do not stray from trail.
2. Fires and camping only at designated areas.
3. Take your litter back home.
4. Purify all water used along the trail.
5. Road hiking: Stay on the shoulder, off vehicle surface, travel single file, facing oncoming vehicle traffic.
6. Private land: No bicycles, horses, motor-powered vehicles or snowmobiles unless landowner has given operator written permission for such use. State land: No horses, motor-powered vehicles or snowmobiles unless trail is marked to allow their use. Bicycle use is not authorized by FLTC, unless explicitly approved by state managing agency. No camping within 150' of water sources, roads, or the trail unless designated as such by the state agency.
7. Because the FLT crosses varied terrain, steep slopes, rough footing, and watercourses, hikers must realize that they are responsible for their own safety and judgment in selecting hikes that are within their capabilities.
8. Dogs should be leashed when on the trail on private properties and most state park lands. The dog policy is available on the FLT website.
